



MULTILINGUALISM EU SUMMER SCHOOL IN LUXEMBOURG

After a successful first edition in 2024, the Multilingualism EU Summer School in Luxembourg is returning in 2025! Join the Summer School and meet like-minded students from other EU countries while learning about the linguistic services of the EU institutions in the Grand Duchy.

The Multilingualism EU Summer School is a one-week, in-person programme that combines professional training with social activities. The professional training includes workshops and presentations offered by various EU translation services and the interpretation service of the Court of Justice of the European Union, covering topics such as terminology and clear language. You will learn about how these services operate, what skills are required to work for them, and much more.

Furthermore, the programme is packed with social activities, with the participants enjoying dinners together in the evenings and a guided tour of the city of Luxembourg. The social activities are designed to demonstrate why multilingualism is key for Luxembourg and what life in the Grand Duchy can offer.

A total of 35 students from all corners of the European Union will enjoy this on-site programme in Luxembourg, one of the three capitals of the European Union. Could this opportunity be for you?
